This MA focuses on the analysis of environmental change and natural resource management, mainly, but not exclusively, in developing countries. It considers how environmental concerns can be addressed in decision-making and policy-making. The programme takes a multi-disciplinary approach, and draws on teaching and research from a range of academic disciplines. It is intended for students interested in researching or working in the field of environmental management in developing countries and for those hoping to embark on related careers.

The programme consists of four courses followed by a long dissertation (20,000 words) or five courses followed by a short dissertation (10,000 words). Each course is assessed by a 5,000 word term paper.

Environmental Systems, Stability and Change

Core course
 Introduction to environmental systems, including their dynamic nature and interaction with the development

Political Economy of the Environment

Core course
 A theoretical foundation for discussions of the social, political and economic context of environmental change and natural resource management.

International Relations of Global Environmental Change

Option: Spring
 Concerned with the social, economic, political and cultural qualities of environmental change, including the way in which 'environmentalism' is constructed and developed as a political

Issues in Development and Environment

Option: Spring
 Focuses on new approaches to ecological change and environmental management, including community-based approaches.

Rural Production Systems

Option: Spring
 A detailed examination of the relationship between rural production systems and the environment.

Environmental Policy and Industrial Technology

Option: Spring
 Analysis and criticism of the formulation of policies intended to contribute to protection of the environment and public health.

Geographical Information Systems Option: Summer

An introduction to the possibilities and problems associated with the use of Geographical Information Systems and remote sensing in the design and monitoring of development planning.
