INVITATION

You are invited to attend the 3rd International Conference on Integrated Environmental Management in Southern Africa (Sub Saharan Africa) to be held in Johannesburg, South Africa, from August 27 to August 30, 2002, one week ahead of the Johannesburg Earth Summit¹. The conference is being jointly organized by the University of the Witwatersrand, SCIEM Centre for Innovative Environmental Management, Johannesburg, South Africa and Gerhard-Mercator University of Duisburg, Instrumental Analytical Chemistry, Germany.

The focus of the conference is "Integrated Environmental Management in Southern Africa – Contribution to the New Millennium in Africa". The conference aims to emphasize the most important environmental issues and the need to improve environmental management in Africa. It will aim to contribute to the development and implementation of new and innovative environmental management policies and approaches for Africa as well as to provide a platform for discussing and presenting new methods, tools and technologies.

The subject of the conference is of concern nationally, regionally and internationally. This is due to the increased need for technology and knowledge transfer, historical learning experiences, emerging consciousness about the role and importance of Africa in the global environmental management. Africa also needs to become a leader in environmental protection and management due to its unique resources of global importance.

By reviewing environmental problems in Southern Africa and current solutions, the conference aims to identify the areas of the most pronounced priorities and to provide an input to the Earth Summit and contribute to appropriate solutions for managing the African environment in the future.

The conference will also focus on Environmental Education in Southern Africa and its role for the future.

¹ The World Summit on Sustainable Development (also known as Rio + 10), will be a summit gathering from 2 - 11 September 2002 in <u>Johannesburg</u>, <u>South Africa</u>, of world governments, concerned citizens, United Nations agencies, multilateral financial institutions and other major actors to assess global change since the historic <u>United</u> Nations Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED), of 1992.

The CEMSA 2002 Conference

During the last few years, the development of environmental management, regulation and control techniques has progressed in most African countries. In Southern Africa, several countries are reviewing the existing environmentally related policy and legislation in line with new challenges, contemporary international experiences and integrated environmental management principles and approaches.

With the Earth Summit on Sustainable Development to be held in Johannesburg, South Africa, during the first week of September 2002 Southern Africa will be in the focus of international environmental community. Many research and other environmental management projects are being carried out throughout the region to respond to the focused global interest on Africa.

This conference will promote the transfer and exchange of the latest information and knowhow on environmental management and related problems in an attempt to provide a significant contribution to the Earth Summit deliberations. The conference will also provide a good opportunity for the engineer, scientist, researcher, consultant and professional practitioner to network with others, discuss key issues and open up business and other opportunities.

The conference will run over 4 days and it is expected that during the first 3 days a joint plenary session each morning will be assigned to two keynote speakers (topics to be decided). Parallel sessions will be run after the joint session in which more specific issues of relevance to participants will be addressed. The fourth day will be devoted to round table debate on environmental problems of Southern Africa, appropriate international experiences and identification of the framework for the future. international cooperation and networks to bring the state of the art technology and know-how to Africa and to transfer African experiences to other parts of the world will be addressed.

Special keynote speakers will be selected to ensure the conference delivers the most upto-date information and research results as well as the latest policy developments in environmental engineering, science, management, policy and regulation worldwide.

Throughout the conference time will be assigned for networking, poster presentations and an exhibition. On the evening of the second day, a formal dinner will be arranged. Optional field trips of interest to conference attendants will be available at extra cost. In addition pre and post conference trips for delegates and accompanying persons will be arranged, and publicised in the second announcement.

Call for Papers/Abstracts

Oral and poster papers & presentations are invited on any of the listed topics and related areas.

Abstracts should be submitted on line at <u>www.cemsa.org</u> or by email to <u>cemsa2002@civil.wits.ac.za</u>. Exceptionally, abstracts can be faxed to +27 11 403 8851 using the abstract submission form as attached. The abstract should include the study objectives, results and tentative conclusions.

Authors will be informed about inclusion of their presentations in the conference programme by the middle of January 2002 and the deadline for the submission of full papers is May 1, 2002. Instructions for the preparation of papers/posters are attached.

Call for Papers/Abstracts

Pre and post conference short courses/workshops on a number of topics will be organised. Details will be provided in the second announcement

Oral/Poster Paper Presentation

Oral papers will be allocated 20 minutes, of which presentation will occupy 15 minutes and discussion will take 5 minutes. Two people will chair each session. Poster papers will be provided with suitable presentation space to ensure authors are able to show and discuss their material to delegates.

All abstracts of conference papers will be printed in advance and made available at the conference, as will full papers on a CD. Papers selected by the scientific committee will be peer reviewed and published in JEMSA Electronic Journal soon after the conference.

Official Language

The official language of the conference will be English and will be used in all correspondence, presentations and publications.


Exhibition and Fees
